



## **Life Group Discussion Questions**

**Sermon: A Question of Significance**  
**I Corinthians 1:26-33**

**Pastor Bill October 7<sup>th</sup>, 2018**

1. Do you think our culture encourages people to feel important? If so, how? And how does it impact you personally, in other words, do you feel this pull towards self-promotion?
2. Bill made the case for our insignificance. How do you feel about being one of 7 billion people? What is the largest crowd you've ever been in, and would you agree that you have little influence/significance in such a large setting?
3. What experiences here on earth remind you most of God's vastness? What reminds you most of His attention to detail?
4. Bill shared about how we can better identify with the boy who handed over his fish and loaves to Jesus, as opposed to Moses, Esther or David. Why? What are your "fish and loaves" that you can hand over to Jesus for Him to use for His glory?
5. I Corinthians 1:31 teaches that if we're going to boast, we must "boast only in the Lord." In a world dead-set on promoting self, what kind of reaction would you expect from others if you obeyed this command? What impact might these reactions have on you?
7. As you read the main Scripture text (I Corinthians 1:26-31), how do you feel about being called foolish, weak, etc? Can you explain how Christ has become our righteousness, holiness and redemption?
8. Bill talked about those magic water capsules and how they turn into something special given water and time. How did Bill relate this to our experience in regards to change and transformation into something special?
9. Share a time in your life where you have – in your mind – played the role of the star of the show (example, Bill shooting baskets as a kid). What roles will you be playing this week, and how can you make much of God in doing so?
