We Welcome Josh Roach to Five Forks!



Many of you are aware that the Church Board invited Josh Roach to come and lead our time of worship and praise this past Sunday morning. This past Monday evening a special board meeting was called in order to discuss and decide whether to extend an offer to Josh to fill the position of Worship Director here at Five Forks. After a good and thorough discussion the board voted and strongly approved (with one dissent) a motion to extend this offer to Josh. Josh has accepted this offer and we will begin working with him on determining a starting date.

We realize this is no small decision for our church, and we do not take it lightly. At our Annual Council meeting last month, I (Bill) recall saying at one point that "Growth means change and change means risk."

Growth: We envision the Lord working through Josh to enhance the depth of worship in our hearts and lives as individuals and as a church.

Change: Bringing Josh onto the staff presents a new dynamic not only for the existing staff, but for the entire congregation as well.

Risk: While many on the board – and in our congregation – are very optimistic about the contributions that Josh will be able to make, there is always risk involved when making such a significant change. This would be a similar risk to the one that the congregation assumed when I was hired (or any of the pastors for that matter).

We are aware of concerns that some of our musicians/vocalists may have. These are concerns that any of us would have when it directly impacts us and our role (our ministry) here at Five Forks. It's been our desire to be clear that whoever is hired for this position is not being brought in to take over and do everything, but instead to work with our musicians/vocalists to help everyone grow. We anticipate learning from Josh even as Josh learns from us.

I speak for the board in expressing appreciation for the comments and feedback that we received this past Sunday. And as could be expected within a large and diverse congregation there was a wide range of feedback with differing opinions. Each of us have certain expectations for what "we are looking for in this position" and we recognize no one person would be able to fulfill each of our expectations perfectly. The feedback highlighted significant areas where Josh is gifted and can move us forward in worship, as well as identifying opportunities for further development. We believe Josh possesses many of those critical skills we are looking for but also has the wisdom and humility to recognize and grow in his areas of weakness as he becomes personally familiar with our church family.

As you pray for our church, please pray for Josh and his wife Laura as they prepare to make this transition. Know that they expressed great appreciation for the manner in which they were greeted and how they were made to feel welcome this past Sunday. Thank you for loving them and for your love for this church.

The Greenville College Choir will join Five Forks Church on Sunday, March 12th for morning worship services, as well as provide a free concert at 6:00pm in the auditorium as part of its 90th anniversary season.

The choir is the flagship choral ensemble of Greenville College, a Free-Methodist liberal arts college in Greenville, IL. Founded in 1927 by Dr. Robert W. Woods, the Greenville Choir has attained a widespread reputation for performing sacred choral music of the highest quality.

In the past several years, the Greenville College Choir has been invited to perform with the Kingsbury Ensemble (one of the Midwest's premier professional early music ensembles), as well as at the Illinois Music Educators Conference and the American Choral Directors Association's Central Division Convention. The Choir regularly joins with the Greenville Choral Union for concerts of larger choral-orchestral works such as Bach's *Magnificat*, Mozart's *Requiem*, and the annual Christmas performance of Handel's *Messiah*.

Holy Spirit in Our Midst

We often think of the Holy Spirit, when we think of Him at all, in terms of ministering to us personally. We say things like, "The Spirit led me", or, "The Spirit spoke to me", as though it were just the two of us.

There is a sense, of course, in which the Spirit does minister to individuals. But if the personal connection is the sum of our understanding about the Holy Spirit, we miss out on His full ministry in our midst. By one Holy Spirit, we have all been baptized into the Body of Christ (1 Cor. 12:13). Thus, our individuality ought to be engaged for the good of that whole Body. Frankly, anything less than that is disobedience, for focusing only on a personal relationship with the Spirit thwarts, or "quenches", His broader focus on the Church.

The New Testament does not teach us that we are on a "personal journey" in this life. Such language arises out of our vigorously independent, "I-can-do-this-myself", culture. The New Testament treats believers as being part of one another in a cooperative, corporative Body called the Church. And it is the Holy Spirit who bonds us together.

During the month of March, we will therefore be looking at what the Bible says about the Spirit's ministry in and through the Church. Hope you can join with me as we explore the Holy Spirit's ministry in our midst. – Pastor Brian

Finding Intimacy With God – The Practice of Prayer

Every one of us has a need for intimacy. "There is a restlessness deep within each of us that compels us to search for the person, the place, the 'god', that will fill the void and give us peace." (Healed) The opposite of finding this is loneliness.

The Scriptures reveal a God, who created this vast universe, and everything in it, but at the same time desires to have, and provides a means by which he will have, an intimate relationship with his most treasured creation – you and me.

Just as conversation between two people fosters intimacy in their relationship, prayer is one means by which we find intimacy with God. For two weeks we will talk about prayer. Psalm 61; Psalm 63; Psalm 46.


